**Program Offer:** A 3-year ACGME accredited fellowship program for Gynecologists and 2-year for Urologists. Each fellowship includes 12 months of research, 12 or 24 months of clinical rotations in Urogynecology, Female Urology, Colorectal/Gastroenterology Surgery, and Minimally Invasive Gynecology Surgery. Fellows are trained in the evaluation and management of pelvic floor prolapse, urinary incontinence, anal incontinence, fistula repair, colorectal pelvic floor dysfunction, urinary diversion, neurogenic bladder, and exposure to complex urologic reconstruction. Fellows receive extensive surgical training in vaginal laparoscopic, robotic, and abdominal surgical approaches. A formal research and methodology curriculum with associated degree is available and in place.
