Description: The goal of our newly developed three-year program is to train fellows to become leaders and experts in women's health and female pelvic medicine and reconstructive surgery (FPMRS) while pursuing a rigorous academic career. The clinical and research training experience will be multidisciplinary utilizing the expertise of urology, colo-rectal surgery, gastroenterology, gerontology, psychiatry, physical therapy and neurology, working with the Pelvic Floor Disorders Service, a multidisciplinary collaboration of clinicians at Massachusetts General Hospital. The program also emphasizes the development of clinician scientists who will develop and implement relevant and important basic science, translational, and clinical research in the field of female pelvic medicine and reconstructive surgery. Fellows have the opportunity to participate in basic science research in the Vincent Center for Reproductive Biology, during two six-month research rotations.

Other Degrees or Curricula Offered: Additional training, including a completion of the Summer Program in Clinical Effectiveness, may be available on a case-by-case basis. We anticipate that the rigorous academic and research curriculum provided within the fellowship will enable the fellow to pursue an academic career in basic, translational or clinical research.
