Program Description: This accredited, three-year fellowship has been training fellows for over fifteen years and provides a comprehensive approach to pelvic floor disorder management. Fellows will receive a broad spectrum of surgical training, and by graduation will be highly skilled in performing laparoscopic, vaginal and robotic surgery as well as maintaining skills in abdominal surgery. Clinic experience includes a wide variety of outpatient urogynecologic evaluation and treatment as well as office procedures such as neuromodulation and botox injections. The division consists of four fellowship trained urogynecologists and a senior gynecologist with advanced laparoscopic skills. A colorectal rotation and urology experience are provided. We are affiliated with Harvard Medical School and are involved in teaching residents from a Harvard affiliated tertiary care center. Research time is divided into blocks that increase with successive year in training. Extensive research resources are also available from the greater Harvard community. Urogynecology fellows do not have any obstetric obligations.
