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Description:

The Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery Fellowship at TriHealth is a three-year ACGME accredited fellowship.

The goal of the program is to develop well-rounded FPMRS specialists that are excellent clinicians, expert surgeons and accomplished researchers. We select candidates that are committed to the compassionate care of women, as well as education and leadership in the field.

Our three-year curriculum focuses on the evaluation and management of urinary incontinence, pelvic organ prolapse, defactory dysfunction, anal incontinence and other lower urinary symptoms. Fellows will receive experience through an extremely large volume of patients that are managed both medically and surgically. Medical management includes physical therapy, pharmacologic therapy and the use of pessaries and other medical procedures (i.e. sacral neuromodulation and Botox). Surgical management includes a wide variety of procedures performed vaginally, laparoscopically, and robotically. Fellows also rotate with Female Urology, Colorectal Surgery, Physical Therapy, and Gastroenterology. Research experience is provided via one-year protected time alongside close faculty mentorship.

Other Degrees or Curricula Offered: Masters in Science in Research on a case by case basis.
