Description: ACGME-approved 3-year fellowship in Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery. Our program is sponsored jointly by the Departments of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences and Urology, giving the fellows access to FPMRS faculty from both departments in our fully integrated Section of Urogynecology and Reconstructive Pelvic Surgery. The Yale fellowship program is designed to provide exceptional training for the comprehensive management of women with pelvic floor disorders. Clinically, fellows are exposed to the complete breadth of non-surgical and surgical treatment options, including office-based therapies, neuromodulation, laparoscopic, robotic, abdominal, and vaginal surgeries. Fellows will be prepared for a productive academic career as FPMRS faculty offer full participation in basic science, translational and clinical research projects during the duration of the fellowship. There is also a strong collaborative relationship with dedicated gastrointestinal and colorectal faculty, providing direct experience in the evaluation and treatment of complex colorectal disorders from a multidisciplinary approach.
